 - a. Reduction/Combination of state & district offices to accommodate our smaller association

 - c. Culinary skill training were offered to each district participants received knives and aprons for their programming
 - d. Supported the Dinah Gore Research and Teaching Kitchens, housed at NC State University, that will enhance training and outreach opportunities for FCS
 - e. Simplified awards application and judging process to increase number of award applications and sustain interest in District VP of Award & Recognition role
 - f. Conducted a two-month Living Well Challenge to support members in adopting a new healthy habit. Twenty-one members accepted and accomplished the challenge.
