We currently face three critical challenges in New Mexico, first are budget cuts from declining state and county revenue from the Covid pandemic and declining oil and gas prices. The second critical challenge we face our earlier than scheduled retirements caused by the changing dynamics of extension work due to Covid and University early retirement incentive design to reduce universities budget. Our third challenge is the aging of current extension participants, and the difficulty to draw a younger audience into extension programs.
