Impact statements selected for 2021;

Financial Management-Financial Education Empowers 11,817 Arkansans to use reliable resources and empower individuals to build financial stability.

Protecting Our Resources-Arkansas provided an Arkansas Extension Homemakers Council: Learning, Leading and Lending a Hand reaching 13,241 participants through 95 programs. This program was a response to COVID-19 and the initial shortage of personal protective equipment, EHC members made and donated 57,387 cloth face masks to essential workers, hospitals, pharmacies, cancer patients, nursing homes and schools.

What are your Affiliate's goals for the next 12 months?

Planning to increase contacts with membership via Zoom monthly sessions and coordinated meetings during Inservice trainings.

What challenges do Cooperative Extension and/or Family & Consumer Sciences face in your state?

A major challenge for our state is having qualified FCS applicants for positions as County Agents. Because of the lack of qualified applicants some positions are being filled with individuals that do not have college FCS courses on their transcripts and the position are shifted to a higher percentage for 4-H and less FCS emphasis.
