- 4. Some of members are working on adding to the body of knowledge on Extension volunteers in 2023.
- 5. Idaho is also continuing to work towards health equity in our communities as we are involved in the National Well Connected Communities Initiative.
- 6. Several members intend to create a national workgroup to present a virtual cooking series for adults.
- 7. One of our members, Karen Richel, will be putting on a live financial conference with sponsors and speakers supporting it.
- 8. Members will continue to offer health and nutrition programs. The programs noted are: diabetes prevention and management programs (DPP and Dining with Diabetes), heart healthy programs, and UI Extension Pantry courses.

- 1. A current lack of specialists to support Family and Consumer Sciences Extension professionals in the state of Idaho.
- 2. Our members have experienced challenges with getting in-person enrollment for face-to-face classes offered.

- 3. Our affiliate members feel that connection has been limited, as well as there has been a struggle to be valued by our University's college and department.
- 4. No central University of Idaho Extension online (web) location or platform for online/recorded free programs (non-credit).
