In 2025, the Arizona Affiliate strengthened statewide visibility, leadership, and member engagement across multiple professional initiatives. Highlights include:

Awards and Recognition

- Received 1 Western Region Award and 1 National Service Award.
- Submitted **11 NEAFCS Impact Statements**, resulting in recognition across four categories: Community Health, Diabetes Prevention, Financial Management, and Food & Nutrition.

 These spotlights showcased effective Extension programming and interdisciplinary impact statewide.

Leadership and Advocacy

- Maintained a fully staffed Executive Board and Officer roster, ensuring continuity in Affiliate governance.
- Continued representation on national NEAFCS committees, supporting professional advocacy and advancing the role of FCS nationwide.

Professional Development

 The Affiliate President and President-Elect attended JCEP Extension Leadership Conference (ELC) and copresented a professional development breakout session, contributing to national dialogue and professional learning.

• Recruit and retain members through increased outreach, mentorship, and communication strategies that demonstrate value for engagement.

Representation and Leadership

- Maintain active participation in JCEP ELC and other national leadership development opportunities.
- Expand representation on **NEAFCS national committees and the National Board**.

What challenges do Cooperative Extension and/or Family & Consumer Sciences face in your state?

The Affiliate recognizes ongoing challenges impacting program delivery, staffing, and member participation:

- **Geographic complexity and diversity** across Arizona's large counties create barriers to uniformly addressing stakeholder needs with limited personnel and resources.
- Decreased Family, Consumer, and Health Sciences (FCHS) staffing and loss of positions have led to a
 reduction in active and associate members (from 33 to 21 Active Members and from 12 to 7 Associate Members),
 limiting representation and leadership capacity.
