

Jan Scholl has been tireless in locating the history and promoting the research of the Extension Family and Consumer Sciences profession. Within NEAFCS, she was the first editor of the Journal of NEAFCS from 2003 to 2006 (editorial committee for 5 years) and served as affiliate vice president and president (2003). As historian (8 years), she compiled the history of NEAFCS Extension and created archival collections at the university and National Agricultural libraries. She co-published a comparison of two NEAFCS national studies (1984 and 2009) in 2011.

Dr. Scholl served on two national conference committees, contributing the historical content for the program in 2007. Historic films were presented at the Alabama Theatre in Birmingham. She also presented concurrent sessions at eight conferences and 16 state affiliate meetings (in 2014).

Dr. Scholl has reviewed journal articles, conference submissions, and educator tenure packets. She was the associate editor of the Journal of AAFCS for 8 years; guest editor of two special issues on Extension FCS in 2013 and 2017. In addition, she wrote biographies of African American Extension FCS pioneers, determined why Extension FCS was included in the Smith Lever Act, and published an Extension FCS graduate research bibliography (1916-2002). She has given international papers in 20 countries, and continues to create and promote the EFNEP and 4-H national on-line databases that include both graduate and professional studies. This, in addition to her previous “day job” of developing more than 60 state Extension bulletins and video productions, including the popular *Portable Kitchen* guide and the *Food Preparation DVD Flashcards* (and providing training for Extension educators, FCS and 4-H groups.)

Currently, Jan is serving on the grand jury of Pennsylvania; Vice President of the Americas, International Federation of Home Economics; EFNEP 50<sup>th</sup> Conference keynoter; and is writing another Extension FCS biography with a Belgian visiting professor at Cornell University.
